This is one of my most important times where I like to see their impressive faces, their reactions, and their love on what they see in these times. Where we take them to visit places that we know whey will be unable to visit and enjoy the way they enjoy with us.

And last, my favorite fundraising event of the company, Magic Night, this event is my favorite event that I look for it every year. This is the day that I enjoy the most. Where I can help my company with my time to shine, to show one of my talent as a model. Not only that to meet other people with different expectation, views, and ideas to improve what we love most, our participants. I wish that I can inject my energy and my charisma to those that are around me. The love that only one that gives me to extended to all human being made by God. And therefore, I still at UCP, the love that God's give me to give to others.
